- 1.1 None.
- 2 MINUTES OF THE MEETING HELD ON 10 SEPTEMBER 2018
- 2.1 The minutes of the meeting held on 10 September 2018 were submitted for approval.

2.2 **RESOLVED** to approve the minutes of the last meeting as a correct record.

- 3 MATTERS ARISING
- 3.1 There were no matters arising.
- 4 CAPITAL STRATEGY AND TREASURY MANAGEMENT
- 4.1 The Treasurer presented the report and Ms Forrest then led Members through the report, with the aid of a detailed presentation, and answered Members' questions.
- 4.2 The report contained information about how capital expenditure, capital financing and treasury management activity contribute to the provision of a fire and rescue service along with an overview of how associated risk is managed and the implications for future financial sustainability. The report also included the prudential indicators and treasury strategies that need approval by the Fire and Rescue Authority.
- 4.3 In response to a member's question, ACO MacArthur confirmed that officers are ensuring that the capital planning process is robust and that revenue implications are considered when any new capital spend is being sought.
- 4.4 Members were informed that through collaboration with other public sector organisations in North Wales, the Service has better utilisation of assets. There is currently an ongoing condition survey being undertaken on all buildings and this will inform and ensure prioritisation of any future building works that will be required.

4.5 **RESOLVED** to recommend to the Fire and Rescue Authority that it approves each of the five key elements of the report as set out below:

- (i) overall Capital Strategy;
- (ii) Prudential Indicators;
- (iii) Treasury Management Strategy for 2019/20;
- (iv) Investment Strategy;
- (v) Minimum Revenue Provision Policy.
- 5 INTERNAL AUDIT STRATEGY AND ANNUAL PLAN 2019/20
- 5.1 Keith V Williams from the Internal Audit Department of CCBC presented the Internal Audit Strategy and Annual Plan 2019/20. Members were asked to consider and approve the document in compliance with the Public Sector Internal Audit Standards.

- 5.2 The overall strategy of Internal Audit is to deliver a risk based audit plan in a professional, independent manner, in compliance with the Public Sector Internal Audit Standards 2013. The Strategy identifies how the Internal Audit Service will assist the Authority to accomplish its objectives by bringing a systematic, disciplined approach to evaluate and improve the effectiveness of risk management, control and governance processes.
- 5.3 It was noted that in addition to the planned audit work, ongoing assurances are provided throughout the year due to the financial work that CCBC undertakes for the Authority.
